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Confidentiality and Privacy



VAWA Victim Service Confidentiality Requirements

□ VAWA SEC. 3. NONDISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIAL OR PRIVATE INFORMATION.—

"(A) IN GENERAL.—In order to ensure the safety of adult, youth, and child victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking, and their families, grantees and subgrantees under this title shall protect the confidentiality and privacy of persons receiving services."

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How Do I Protect Confidentiality and Privacy?

□ You are prohibited from sharing personally identifying information about victims without "reasonably time-limited, written and informed consent...."

What Does This Mean?


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- □ Personally identifying information
- □ Consent
 - □ Reasonably time-limited
 - □ Written
 - □ Informed consent

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Mandatory Reporting of Elder Abuse or Abuse of Vulnerable Adults







If You Are a Mandated Reporter...

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- □ Create clear policies for mandatory reporting in your agency
- □ Alert victim at the onset of services
- □ Invite victim to be involved when report is made
- □ Work with victim on a safety plan

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Mandatory Reporting: Working with Victims

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Summary

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- Advocates must respect privacy and confidentiality within the legal limits of mandatory reporting laws
- Advocates need to understand their legal obligations with mandatory reporting and confidentiality requirements
- Creating policies and practices for mandatory reporting requirements can minimize any unintended consequences to victims and promote autonomy and safety
