Ann Turner is the Elder Victim Services and Advocacy Coordinator for the National Clearinghouse on Abuse in Later Life (NCALL), a project of End Domestic Abuse Wisconsin (End Abuse). In her role at NCALL, she provides leadership on improving response to older survivors and has trained extensively throughout the United States.

Turner has been working in the domestic and sexual assault services field since 1981. She worked with allies in a small rural area of northwestern Wisconsin to start a domestic and sexual abuse services agency and served as the Executive Director of the program for 20 years. Turner authored a resource booklet titled “Working with Older Victims in Rural Communities” and co-authored a training curriculum, “A Collaborative Victim Centered Response to Abuse in Later Life,” as well as a chapter on Domestic Abuse in Later Life for a book titled “Domestic Violence Mosaic: Culturally Competent Practice with Diverse Populations.” In 1991, Turner received the Bonnie Brandl Outstanding Systems Advocate Award from the WCADV. In 2001, she received a blanket, a symbol of honor, from the St Croix Ojibwa Tribe for her work with the tribal community.

Turner works out of her home in rural Northwestern Wisconsin.
