The National Clearinghouse on Abuse in Later Life (NCALL) is a national project of WCADV, created in 1999 with funding from the Department of Justice's Office on Violence Against Women. Today NCALL is a nationally-recognized leader on program development, policy and technical assistance, and training that addresses the nexus between domestic violence, sexual assault, and elder abuse and neglect.

NCALL's mission is to eliminate abuse in later life. Through advocacy and education, NCALL strives to challenge and change the beliefs, policies, practices, and systems that allow abuse to occur and continue. NCALL also aims to improve victim safety by increasing the quality and availability of victim services and support.

Disclaimer—NCALL staff telephoned and/or emailed all of the programs listed in this directory in order to gather information to provide a description of their services. These programs were in existence at the time this directory was published. Staffing and funding changes may have occurred. This directory describes programs that agreed to be listed. NCALL and WCADV are not promoting or endorsing any programs in this directory.

INTRODUCTION

NCALL defines victims/survivors of abuse in later life as women and men age 50 and older who have been harmed by someone with whom they have an ongoing relationship with an expectation of trust (e.g., spouse, partner, adult child, family member, or caregiver). The forms of abuse can include a variety of tactics, including, but not limited to: physical, sexual, and emotional abuse, financial exploitation, neglect, intimidation, coercion, stalking, and dating violence.

Spouses, partners, adult children, other family members, and caregivers hurt older people every day in our communities. Often these victims do not know where to turn for help. Professionals and family members may not know what services are available to help older people they care about. Following is a list of agencies to consider when you or someone you know is in need of help.

- **Domestic Violence Programs**—generally offer emergency housing, 24-hour help lines, support groups, peer counseling, legal and other systems advocacy, safety planning, and community education.

- **Sexual Assault Programs**—generally offer counseling, health care advocacy, court accompaniment, support groups, 24-hour help lines, and community education.

- **Adult Protective Services/Elder Abuse (APS) Agencies**—generally investigate allegations of abuse/neglect and exploitation, and provide case management, monitoring, and evaluation. Staff may also provide or arrange for provision of medical, social, economic, legal, housing, law enforcement, or other protective, emergency, or supportive services.

- **Aging Services**—often can provide transportation, chore services, respite care, recreational services, financial planning, information and referral, support groups, meal services, and housing for older victims.

- **Long-Term Care Ombudsmen**—are advocates for residents of nursing homes, board and care homes, and assisted living facilities. Ombudsmen provide information about how to find a facility and what to do to get quality care.

Many of the services listed above are helpful for older victims of domestic and sexual abuse in later life. However, this directory's purpose is to highlight the many agencies throughout the country which have created specialized services designed specifically for older victims of domestic and sexual abuse in later life. Most domestic violence and sexual assault programs throughout the United States will not turn away older victims. However, if the organization did not have specialized services, they were not included in this directory. Likewise, APS, elder

abuse, aging network, and ombudsman programs often serve older victims of abuse. However, if the services were not designed specifically for domestic and sexual abuse in later life, these programs were not included in the specialized services section.

METHODOLOGY

The first National Resource Directory was published in 2005. Several methods were employed to locate programs tailored for older victims of abuse in later life for publication in this first directory. NCALL posted surveys on national websites and contacted domestic violence and sexual assault coalitions, as well as agencies we knew were already doing specialized services for abuse in later life survivors. Since that time, this directory has been updated every two years and efforts have been made to find new programs to include.

While NCALL's aim is to create a comprehensive national resource directory of abuse in later programs, we recognize that some programs may have been omitted and apologize to any such program. We invite you to help us with future revisions by notifying us of any changes or informing us of other programs that serve older abused women or focus on abuse in later life.

We hope you find this 2011 National Resource Directory a helpful tool in your search for services for survivors of abuse in later life.

WHAT IS IN THIS DIRECTORY

For this directory, a broad definition of specialized services was used.

Specialized services may include:

- A domestic violence organization with an elder specialist
- A domestic violence organization with specialized outreach to older persons
- Support groups for older abused women
- Elder shelters and elder transitional housing programs
- APS, aging network, or elder abuse agencies having specialized programming, outreach, or materials on domestic violence and/or sexual assault

Some programs in this directory define abuse in later life and/or their target population differently from NCALL. Contact the programs directly to learn their eligibility requirements.

Projects included in this directory self-identified as addressing domestic abuse in later life. The descriptions are based on interviews with staff. Over time, contact information and services may have changed.

HOW TO USE THIS DIRECTORY

Purpose

NCALL hopes that this directory is useful in several ways: a victim, family member, or caring friend may use it to find services; a program that is considering starting or expanding services for older victims in their community may consult the directory to connect with other programs that have successful specialized services already in place; or programs may simply wish to use the directory to make connections with other programs to share ideas and support in this important work. Whatever purpose, we hope you find the directory to be a valuable resource.

Format

For the first time, this directory will be available as an online database, a format that will allow NCALL to routinely update information. A paper copy will still be available for individuals who request it.

Organization

- Basic Services Listings—Basic services for victims of domestic violence, sexual abuse, or elder abuse are not listed in the directory but can be found by calling the national hotline and resource numbers on domestic violence, sexual assault, elder abuse, abuse in later life, and ombudsman located in the national hotline section of the directory.
- State Listings—Each state’s domestic and sexual violence coalition(s), tribal domestic and sexual violence coalition (if available) and state office of adult protective services contact information are listed under General Resources. States with specialized service programs are listed under the Specialized Programs heading within that state. A brief description of the specialized program is included when available, as well as a list of services and contact information
- Appendices— Listing of categories to help the reader find specific types of services.
